










Laboratory report



No antibodies to hepatitis C virus were detected in the specimen. A false negative result is possible if testing is performed too early after exposure. Long time periods of up to 3 months from infection to antibody production must be expected. Testing of a second specimen is recommended, if index of suspicion for recent infection is high.

HIV-1 p24 antigen and HIV-1/HIV-2 antibodies were not detected. There is no laboratory evidence of infection with the Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).

No antibodies to Treponema pallidum were detected in the specimen. This result, however, does not exclude very recent infection, as the body requires periods of up to 3 months to produce antibodies after an exposure.



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DNA of *Chlamydia trichomatis* was not detected in the specimen. There is no evidence of Infection.

Neisseria gonorrhoea DNA was detected in the specimen. *N. gonorrhoea* is a bacterium which causes the sexually transmitted disease gonorrhoea, sometimes referred to as "the clap". The infection is often considered "silent" and does not always show symptoms. First noticeable symptoms are discharge, burning sensations during urination, or pain while having sex. If not treated, Gonorrhoea is associated with complications that may result in infertility. There is a high prevalence of co-infection with *Chlamydia trichomatis* and an increased susceptibility to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).

DNA of *T. vaginalis* was not detected in the specimen. There is no laboratory evidence of infection with trichomoniasis.

HPV type 16 was not detected in the specimen.

The HPV types 31, 33, 35, 39, 45, 51, 52, 56, 58, 59, 66 or 68 were not detected.

There was no evidence of *M. genitalium* in the specimen.

M. hominis was not detected in the specimen, there is no evidence of infection.

:DNA of *T. vaginalis* was not detected in the specimen. There is no laboratory evidence of infection with trichomoniasis.

DNA of *U. parvum* was not detected in the specimen. There is no evidence of Infection.

Ureaplasma urealyticum was not detected in the specimen. There is no laboratory evidence of infection.

Indeterminate: Repeat testing has yielded inconclusive results. This could be due to pretreatment by antibiotics or other medications, inadequate specimen collection, substances inhibitory to the assay in the specimen, a slightly increased "false positive" signal, or the presence of infectious organism at a concentration below the detection capability of this assay. A result of Indeterminate does not imply a positive result or that any infectious organism was conclusively identified. Verisana suggests consulting with your physician regarding further confirmatory testing for this organism.
