Antibodies to hepatitis C virus (HCV) were detected in the specimen. The presence of HCV antibodies does not constitute a diagnosis of hepatitis C but may be indicative of recent and/or past infection by hepatitis C virus. Hepatitis C is a viral infection that causes liver inflammation. The infection is usually asymptomatic. When symptoms do occur, they can include fatigue, nausea, muscle aches or jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eyes). Only about 15 % of infected persons recover spontaneously within 6



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months. However, most people develop a chronic infection that may cause life-threatening problems such as liver failure when left untreated.
